- Shutdown, disconnect all cables from the system and ground yourself

1 Introduction

PCIe-GL26 is an AI-enabled automotive six-port GMSL2 camera frame grabber card. It is a turnkey industrial-grade frame grabber solution that incorporates drivers for selected GMSL2 cameras with video streaming sample codes.

PCIe-GL26 aims to provide superior outdoor vision capability with automotive GMSL2 camera connectivity to advanced x86 autonomous vehicle computing platforms. Automotive GMSL2 cameras are ideal for autonomous vehicle applications due to their advanced features, such as IP67 waterproof, high dynamic range (120dB HDR), auto white balance (AWB), and LED flicker mitigation (LFM). It also benefits computer vision applications in outdoor environments where

illumination conditions are constantly changing. Powerful x86 computers with PCIe-GL26 can obtain high-quality images with minimal latency regardless of lighting conditions, from bright sunny days to pitch-black nights.

With a half-length, standard height, and single-slot form factor, PCIe-GL26 can be accommodated in most host computers with a PCIe expansion. With pre-built sample codes, a host computer can install up to four PCIe-GL26 cards and support up to 24x GMSL2 camera streams. Featuring a unique synchronization mechanism, it is



capable of acquiring images from six GMSL2 cameras simultaneously within microseconds of channel-to-channel skew. It can also accept a GPS PPS signal to align image data with LIDAR or PCIe-GL26 in another host machine.

Powered by Jetson Xavier[™] NX, PCIe-GL26 is much more than just a GMSL2 frame grabber card. With 21 TOPS AI performance, 6x GSML2 camera inputs, 1x GPS PPS input, 1x RS232, and 1x isolated CAN 2.0, PCIe-GL26 is an AI camera sensor hub capable of sensor fusion and data pre-processing for ADAS or autonomous vehicles.




2.1 Unpacking Your PCle-GL26


2.2 Panel Side Connectivity

1.	FAKRA Z connectors	There are six FAKRA Z connectors on the panel side of PCIe-GL26 designed to connect to GMSL2 cameras.
2.	8-pin terminal block	The 8-pin terminal includes isolated signals for GPS PPS input, CAN 2.0, and a RS-232 COM port.



2.2.1 FAKRA Z Connector




Fachkreis Automobil (FAKRA) connector is a German standard for SubMiniature version B based automotive-grade connectors. There are six FAKRA Z connectors on the panel side of PCIe-GL26 to connect to automotive GMSL2 cameras.







1.	4-pin 12V DC input	When PCIe-GL26 is not installed in a computer (without PCIe supplying power), the 4-pin Supports 12V DC input as power source for independent develop use.
2.	Gigabit Ethernet	The Ethernet ports support 10/ 100/ 1000Mbps network connections.
3	DisplayPort	Support display resolutions up to 3840 x 2160. Compatible with HDMI/DVI via an active adapter/ cable (support resolution may vary).
4	USB2.0 ports	The USB 2.0 ports are compatible with USB 1.1 / 1.0.



2.3.1 4-pin 12V DC Input



When PCIe-GL26 is not installed in a computer (without the PCIe slot supplying power), the 4-pin plug can support 12V DC input as the power source for independent develop use.



2.3.2 Ethernet Port




There is a Ethernet port that is compatible with 1000/ 100/ 10 Mbit link speeds. Relevant drivers may need to be installed before you can utilize the port.

2.3.3 DisplayPort




The system has a DisplayPort (DP) output which is a digital display interface that mainly connect video source and carry audio to a display device. It can deliver up to 3840 x 2160 in resolution and is designed to support **active** DP adapter/ cable. You can connect to display devices using DP-to-HDMI cable or DP-to-DVI cable.

Relevant drivers may need to be installed before you can utilize the port.



2.3.4 USB2.0 Port




The USB2.0 ports are backward compatible with USB 1.1 and USB 1.0 devices. Legacy USB support is also provided so you can use USB keyboard/mouse in DOS environment.

2.4 Onboard NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX Module




The PCIe-GL26 features a dedicated slot for NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX module .



If your PCIe-GL26 came with an NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX preinstalled, the thermal pads (for Xavier NX and NVMe SSD) at the bottom of the heatsink will be removed during the factory installation process.



2.5 Onboard M.2 2242 M Key Slot for NVMe SSD



PCIe-GL26 has a Gen3 x1 PCIe M.2 2242 slot for you to install an NVMe SSD. The M.2 NVMe SSD offers significantly better system performances when compared to a 2.5" SSD.



If your PCIe-GL26 came with an NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX preinstalled, the thermal pads (for Xavier NX and NVMe SSD) at the bottom of the heatsink will be removed during the factory installation process.




2.6 PCIe-GL26 Board ID DIP Switch

In case you are looking to install multiple cards, there is a set of DIP switches (indicated in **blue**) for users to configure board ID. The board ID can be used as a parameter in API to specify the card.

Board ID Settings

The following illustrations describe DIP switch board ID settings. When installing multiple cards, please remember to set a different ID for each card.

3 System Installation

Before you install PCIe-GL26 into the host computer, it is recommended that you setup the onboard ID via the DIP switch, and install the NVMe SSD before installing PCIe-GL26 into the host computer.

Once you have set up the DIP switch ID of your PCIe-GL26 for multi-card installation, and the NVMe SSD, then you are ready to install the it into the host computer system. Please refer to the following installation procedures.


Before disassembling the system enclosure and installing the card, please read the following instructions:

- **DO NOT** remove the card out of the anti-static until you are ready to install it into the system.
- It is recommended that only qualified service personnel should install and service this product to avoid injury or damage to the system.
- Please observe all ESD procedures at all times to avoid damaging the equipment.
- Before disassembling your system, please make sure the system has powered off, all cables and antennae (power, video, data, etc.) are disconnected.
- Place the system on a flat and sturdy surface (remove from mounts or out of server cabinets)
 before proceeding with the installation/ replacement procedure.




3.1 Heatsink Removal


To access the NVME slot, the heatsink and fan must be remove and separated from the PCB. To do so, please remove the screws indicated in the illustration shown below.



Disconnect the 3-pin fan power cable, and gently remove the heatsink.








Remove the heatsink, note the position of the two fan 3-pin plugs



3.2 NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX Installation

To install the NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX module, please refer to the following instructions:

- 1. To remove the heatsink, please refer to the this <u>section</u>.
- 2. Insert the NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX module on a 45 degree angle into the slot, press down until it clicks in on both sides.



- 3. Remove the thermal pad protective film at the bottom of the heatsink.
- 4. Reinstall the heatsink to complete the NVIDIA Jetson Xavier NX module installation.




3.3 M.2 2242 M Key NVMe SSD Installation

To install the M.2 2242 M key NVMe SSD, please refer to the following instructions:

- 1. To remove the heatsink, please refer to this <u>section</u>.
- 2. Insert the M.2 2242 NVMe SSD on a 45 degree angle into the slot.



3. Press the SSD down and secure it with a screw.




- 4. Remove the thermal pad protective film at the bottom of the heatsink.
- 5. Reinstall the heatsink to complete the NVMe SSD



3.4 Reinstalling the Heatsink


1. To reinstall the heatsink, connect the two 3-pin fan power connectors.

2. Secure the screws indicated to complete the heatsink installation process.






3.5 Installing PCle-GL26 into the Host Computer

To install the PCIe-GL26 into the host computer, please refer to the following instructions:

- 1. Save and close all work in progress on the host computer.
- 2. Power off and unplug the power cable from the host computer you wish to install to.
- 3. Open the chassis (side panel) of the host computer you wish to install the PCle-GL26 into.
- 4. Locate the x4 PCIe slot or a spare and compatible x16/ x8 PCIe slot.
- 5. Align and insert PCIe-GL26's gold finger into the PCIe slot.



6. Secure the PCIe-PoE454at to the chassis with a screw.



7. Reinstall the system's chassis (panel) to complete the hardware installation process.




3.6 Installing Multiple PCle-GL26 into the Host Computer




Before setting up and installing multiple PCle-GL26 cards, please make sure the PCle slots on your host computer's motherboard can accommodate such configuration, and board ID has been set via the <u>DIP switches</u>.

To install multiple PCIe-GL26 cards, copper stands need to be installed onto the PCB to ensure proper spacing. Please refer to the following instructions:

1. To install two PCle-GL26 cards, please utilize the female-female 20mm copper stands provided, and secure with a screw.



 To install more than two PCIe-GL26 cards, the cards positioned in the middle need to use the male-female copper stands. Please make sure the PCIe slots on the motherboard is positioned to accommodate three PCIe cards.





3. Once the copper stands have been installed, gently lower the cards into the host computer system's PCle slots.





Make sure the copper stands are properly secured

Superior view – secure the cards to the host computer with the screws indicated.

4 Reflashing the PCIe-GL26

PCIe-GL26 is shipped with JetPack 4.6.1 installed as a turnkey solution. If you are familiar and experienced with the platform, you can skip this section and start your development.

This section will show you how to reflash the PCIe-GL26 with a pre-built system image by Neousys. Just like Jetson Xavier NX Developer Kit, the PCIe-GL26 series can't install its system by itself. In other words, you will need another computer, **Host Machine**, to reflash the PCIe-GL26 by a micro USB to USB type A cable.
